

THIS WEEK'S STORY:

Jesus Healed Ten Men

UNIT MEMORY VERSE:

Isaiah 53:4-5 "Surely he took up our pain and bore our suffering, yet we considered him punished by God, stricken by him, and afflicted. But he was pierced for our transgressions, he was crushed for our iniquities; the punishment that brought us peace was on him, and by his wounds we are healed."

BIG PICTURE QUESTION:

Why did God create people? God created people to worship Him, love Him, and show His glory.

BIBLE PASSAGES:

Read Luke 17

TALK ABOUT IT

1. What did Jesus tell the ten men to do? *Jesus told them to show themselves to the priests. On the way to see the priests, they were healed; Luke 17:14*
2. How many men came back to give thanks? *only one, the Samaritan; Luke 17:15-16.*
3. How many men did Jesus heal of leprosy? *ten*
4. How many returned to praise Jesus and thank Him? *one*
5. What did the man who was healed realize about Jesus? *The man recognized that Jesus had healed him and he praised God; Luke 17:15-16.*
6. How do you show God you are thankful to Him? *Guide kids to discuss the different ways we can give thanks to, glorify, and honor God. Help them see that we can worship God in our words and with our actions. Remind them that obedience to God, parents, and teachers is a great way to show God you trust and love Him. We can also show His love to others.*

APPLY IT

1. What does this story teach me about God, Jesus, the Holy Spirit, or the gospel?
2. What does this story teach me about myself?
3. Are there any commands in this story to obey? How are they for God's glory and my good?
4. Are there any promises in this story to remember? How do they help me trust and love God?
5. How does this story help me live on mission better?

FOR FUN

Sit in a circle as a family. Toss a beanbag or small ball to each other. When the person receives the beanbag or ball, they are to say something for which they are thankful to God. When they are finished, they toss the beanbag or ball to someone else in the circle. Decide how many times to pass the beanbag and ball around the family.

TO SERVE

Get some thank you notes or use a piece of notebook or construction paper. Write a thank you note to someone who has recently given you something or done something nice for your family. It can be a friend who you are thankful for their friendship. A person in your house who loves you is also an option. A final option would be to write God a thank you note to thank Him for who He is and His love for you. Once you have completed the thank you note, mail or deliver it to the person.
